## Home Reading

### Ways to support Learning from Home

As we are really getting into the swing of things at school and the year is well under way, it becomes very helpful for parents to support what is going on at school from home.

Here are some ways to incorporate some learning at home:

<u>Fine Motor Skills</u> -building strength by cutting, using play-dough, a single whole puncher or tongs in the kitchen

<u>Early Literacy</u> — Rhyming games, songs, stories, nursery rhymes, picture books <u>Number Recognition</u> — "Go Fish" with playing cards

Counting - the game "Trouble" or other board games

<u>Letter Recognition</u> - look at signs on the side of the road, license plates or labels on food and ask your child to identify the letters they see
